

Patient Requested Lab Tests

Pay at Test Time and Take Control of Your Results

Lab tests can help you monitor certain health conditions, and they can assist you with communicating with your physician. Patient Requested Lab Tests should not replace regular physician examinations. The Regional Medical Center offers Patient Requested Lab Tests for your convenience.

All tests must be paid for up front with cash, check or credit card. Health Insurance claims will not be filed.

Ordering Patient Requested Lab Tests

Stop by either of our two locations, fill out the Registration Form, pay for your test(s), and the lab specialist will assist you.

How will I receive test results?

Your lab test results will be mailed directly to you within two (2) business days from the day your test was completed. You will need to take the results to your next doctor's appointment if you want to discuss them with your doctor.

All test results will be reviewed by the hospital physician in charge of Patient Requested Lab Tests. If your results are significantly abnormal, the doctor will call you to discuss your results. When you receive your results in the mail, each test will display the normal range so you can understand where improvement is needed.

Patient Requested Lab Tests FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I get my results?

Test results are mailed directly to the patient using the address given on the order form. Results are usually mailed within two business days of the day that the test was completed.

Are there extra fees for collecting, processing or enrolling?

No. There are no extra fees. The total cost of each test will be collected at the time of registration. Cash, checks and credit cards are accepted. Insurance will not be filed.

Will the Regional Medical Center send a copy of the results to my doctor?

No. All results will go directly to the patient. The patient will need to take the results to their doctor at their next appointment.

How can the Regional Medical Center offer these tests at low rates?

Since payments for lab tests are collected up front by cash or credit card, there are no costs of processing insurance claims, invoicing, collecting and other paperwork. So the cost savings is passed on to the patient with low-cost tests.

Can the lab staff explain the results to me?

No. Patient Requested Lab Tests are not a substitute for medical care from a physician. You are encouraged to share the results with your regular doctor.

If I do not have a doctor, what do I do?

Call the Regional Medical Center at (803) 395-2200 and one of the operators will tell you which doctors are accepting new patients in our area.

Is there a minimum age requirement to participate in this program?

Yes. As a general rule, a person must be at least 18 years of age to request testing without being accompanied by a parent or guardian.

May I take a copy of the lab results to my doctor?

Yes. Your lab report is completely official, is recorded in RMC's lab computer files and will include all of the standard data that doctors typically expect to see with your lab result information. RMC will send you a report of your results, and if you wish, you may take them to your physician at your next office visit.

What if some of the test numbers are too low or too high?

If a patient's test numbers are significantly abnormal, the doctor in charge of Patient Requested Lab Tests will call the patient and recommend that they seek medical care. The Regional Medical Center suggests that you follow up with your doctor to best understand your results.
