About the Dialysis Access Institute

The Dialysis Access Institute (DAI) was established at the Regional Medical Center in March 2011 with Dialysis Access Specialist John Ross, MD to serve patients with end-stage renal disease. In its first year, the Dialysis Access Institute team performed more than 3,000 procedures, and physicians from throughout the world visited RMC to be trained in these procedures.

On October 21, 2013 the new, \$6.8 million, 16,000-square-foot Dialysis Access Institute, a world-class facility, opened at the Regional Medical Center. It enables DAI to grow its services for end-stage renal disease patients and decrease patient wait times. DAI is the only facility of its kind dedicated solely to the care of end-stage renal disease patients.

Dialysis Access Surgery Via Live Streaming Video

DAI also provides educational programs for physicians, nurses and technologists regarding dialysis access, both on site and through live video streaming, so that best practices can continue to be developed and reviewed for the patients.

- 6 Pre-Op stations
- 6 Post-Op stations
- 6 Operating/Procedure Suites (2 of which have Live Video Streaming capabilities)
- Stage II Recovery Room and an Extended Recovery Area
- Digital radiology equipment
- Hemodynamic monitors in each room
- Spacious waiting room
- Covered canopy for both the Patient Drop Off and Ambulance entrances
- Large video conferencing room
- Total emergency back-up power throughout facility
